EQUINE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS & BIOSECURITY

Wesley Clover Parks and the Trillium Hunter Jumper Association endeavour to provide a healthy environment for all participants both human and equine. Through biosecurity proven good practices such as proof of vaccination for entry, our Healthy Horses Only Policy, an Equine Health Attestation, regular stall disinfection, manure removal, the ability to isolate sick horses, access to veterinary care and hospitalization; Wesley Clover Parks has a venue specific plan in place in the event of illness. The following are our requirements in addition to the EC rule for vaccines already in place:

1. **Proof of Vaccines:** Proof of vaccines must be emailed to stabling@wesleycloverparks.com indicating the horse's show name and date of administration of EHV 1 & 4 and Equine Influenza (as per Article A519). Competitors failing to meet this requirement will be asked to leave the showgrounds or not permitted entry.
2. **Coggins Test:** Required for all horses on-site and must be available upon request at show management's discretion.
3. **Equine Health Attestation:** As part of Wesley Clover Parks' Healthy Horses Only Policy, each owner and/or trainer by making an entry attests that their competing horse(s) to the best of the owner/trainer's knowledge have been in good health with a resting body temperature below 38.6°C, have shown no signs of undiagnosed respiratory illness nor infectious disease; and that they have not been in contact with any other horses (away or at their home facility) exhibiting symptoms or signs of respiratory illness or infectious disease within the last 21 days. They also agree to continue to monitor their horse's temperature upon arrival and twice daily while on site. Further, all agree to share knowledge of any stabled horses who exhibit symptoms of infectious disease or have had contact with any other horses who exhibit such symptoms, and agree to immediately inform the Organizer by email at entries@wesleycloverparks.com and inform Competition Manager Ken Denouden at 416-409-8614.
4. Complete **contact information** and contact tracing

SITE ENTRY & BIOSECURITY

Overnight security will be on-site, braiders are asked to report in with overnight patrol. In addition to rule A519 Vaccinations, biosecurity measures are in place for horses. It is the braider's responsibility to ensure safe practices are followed if visiting multiple barns. All grooms, trainers and competitors are also responsible to follow safe practices if visiting more than one barn and are expected to limit their traffic footprint to their own stable area. The stabling area is closed to spectators.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

The Trillium Championship Show competitions are EC approved as Bronze and Silver competition members of Equestrian Canada, 201–11 Hines Road, Ottawa, ON K2K 2X1, and are governed by the rules of EC. (A602.1) Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (A602.5)

All persons shall be committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
- Actively promoting the development and adherence of competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

All participants at the Trillium Hunter Jumper Association Championship Show are expected to abide by this Statement of Principles



EC ACCIDENTS & RETURN TO PLAY RULE

Equestrian Canada's concussion related Accidents & Return-to-Play Rule came into effect Jan. 1/2017 for all EC sanctioned competitions in Canada. The full rule can be found in the EC Rules, Section A, General Regulations, Article 101. Key components of the rule include the following:

- In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, the competitors must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel on-site before continuing to compete.
- The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the on-site medical assessment takes place. Should a competitor refuse to be evaluated, they will be disqualified from the competition.
- If on-site qualified medical personnel suspect a concussion or believe the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor will be suspended from competition and placed on a Medical Suspension List until medically released.
- Competitors will remain on the EC Medical Suspension List until they submit an EC Return-to-Play Form, signed by a licensed physician, to EC.
- No competitor shall compete at EC sanctioned competitions while on the EC Medical Suspension List and competition organizers may refuse entry to anyone currently on the list.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS

For those who do not meet the minimum requirements by July 1, the Temporary Coach Status will be applied and should be reviewed in advance. In 2023, minimum Coach Status requirements will be enforced at all EC-sanctioned events. Recognizing some coaches will not have completed their EC Coach Status requirements when enforcement begins, the EC Board approved Temporary Coach Status (TCS) for the 2023 show season. Temporary Coach Status (TCS) will come into effect on July 1, 2023.

Costs of Temporary Coach Status

The fee is determined by the event sanctioning level and the individual coach's EC Coach Status. TCS is valid for one (1) EC-sanctioned event only. The TCS fee will increase annually until it is retired at the end of 2025.

How is Temporary Coach Status obtained?

Coaches complete a TCS Form and submit this to the show office with appropriate payment. EC has mandated that the show office is not permitted to issue numbers to athletes of any coach with insufficient coaching status until the TCS form and fee has been submitted.

- The TCS Form will be available online; coaches are encouraged to complete and print the form before arriving at the show office to expedite processing.
- TCS Forms submitted without payment are incomplete.

Per EC, the TCS fee may not be added to a trainer split or applied to one or more athletes' show bill without written consent from those included on the split and/or bill(s). This fee is to be incurred by the coach and not the athlete(s).

RULES & REGULATIONS

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC Constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC Constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition.

Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. (A602.7)

A602.4 Horse Recording Requirements (2023 Rules Section A Page 27). In competitions that require Horse Recording numbers (all Silver entries), all Canadian entries are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and must have paid the EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete, or if owned by a temporary sport licence holder, a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased at each competition entered. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit.

When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. (A602.9)

1. Program Changes: Every class offered herein is covered by the Rules and Specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book (A602.2). The THJA reserves the right to make changes to classes, change the order of classes, to cancel, reschedule, or combine any division they may deem advisable. All questions not covered by these rules shall be decided by the show management, whose decision will be final.

2. Rider Falls: Remounting not allowed. Rider must be checked by Paramedic before they can return to competition. Horse Falls: Horse must be cleared by a veterinarian before they return to competition. Any fees incurred are the sole responsibility of the competitor. (G. FEI 224.3 Falls)

3. Refusal of Entries: Competitors on the EC Not In Good Standing List or the EC Medical Suspension list (Article 101 Section A, General Regulations) will be refused entries to the show.

4. Helmets: Anyone mounted on a horse on the competition grounds, including foreign competitors, must wear approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times.

5. Numbers: Competition numbers must be worn and be visible at all times during the competition.

6. A horse/pony is limited to one round per class including equitation and medal classes.

7. Hors Concours: Hors concours is not permitted.

8. Drug Testing: Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.

9. Pets: Dogs or pets not left appropriately contained in the stabling area should always be on a leash. The owners of any dog that is caught loose will be subject to a \$100 fine. Owners of loose dogs that disrupt a rider on course will be charged for the entry fee of that class, in addition to the \$100 fine. Owners are required to abide by the "Poop and Scoop" by-law.

10. Vaccinations: All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of **Article A519, Vaccinations:** All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule will be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition Management.

- Cancel or change entries at www.showmanagementsystem.ca until the closing date without penalty.
- All entry cancellations after the closing date must be made in writing to the office (Email above)
- Entries cancelled after the closing date will be assessed a \$50 scratch fee and be required to pay the admin fee, SMS fee and stall costs.
- Post entries will be accepted, but will be subject to a \$30 post entry fee.
- Open cheques or valid credit card hold forms must be delivered to the show office when picking up back number. Please make cheques payable to THJA.
- No charges or changes will be accepted during the show without an open account
- A \$50 charge will be added to accounts that are not closed by the end of the show.
- A \$65 charge will be applied to any cheques that are returned for any reason (NSF Fee)
- Unsettled accounts will be turned over to EC at 14 days which may result in suspension from all competitions.
- Anyone having presented a non negotiable cheque to the THJA in the past will not be permitted to leave an open cheque for entries. They will be required to present cash for entries prior to receiving their number/stall.
- Any adds completed at the ingate or after 4pm the day prior will be charged a \$10/class.
- Adds made the day of a competition will require the competitor to go first in the order of go when applicable.
- Refunds on entries are available only with a veterinarian or doctor's certificate.
- Failure to clear outstanding charges by October 1st 2023 from the Trillium Championship Show will result in disqualification for year end zone awards.
- Any person/business/barn failing to clear their account by the end of the year will be suspended as a THJA member for the following year
- Every pony entered in a pony division must have a valid Equestrian Canada pony measurement on file with Equestrian Canada. USEF pony measurement cards are also acceptable

STABLING

- Stabling can be request form can be found at www.ottawaequestriantournaments.com.
- There will be limited stabling available, please submit stall orders first if you require stalls. You can increase your stall orders anytime by emailing stabling@wesleycloverparks.com. Decreases can only be completed until the closing date.
- Any changes after the closing date must be done through email to stabling@wesleycloverparks.com. Increases/additions to stall counts made after the closing date are not guaranteed to be placed with the trainer's/group's block of stalls.
- Splits must be completed by Saturday at noon. If splits are not complete by this time, the trainer order will be evenly split amongst all entries under the trainer. Splits must be sent via email to stabling@wesleycloverparks.com or written down and accompanied by a signature from the trainer/person responsible.

- Stalls are non-refundable.
- Hay and shavings are non-refundable once delivered and are NOT included in the price of the stall.
- No hay or shavings orders will be accepted after noon on Saturday.
- Any requests sent via text message or email will not be filled.
- Ship ins are permitted subject to an \$85 ship in fee.

Please note that administration and accompanying fees are non refundable under any circumstances once the competition has started.

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- All Canadian owners and riders must have valid EC Bronze or Silver Sport License (depending on division entered) (A205), a provincial membership (Ontario Equestrian or equivalent) (A203) and a 2023 Trillium Hunter Jumper Association membership to compete at the Trillium Championship Show.
- Any USEF owners and riders must have a valid USEF membership, and a 2023 Trillium Hunter Jumper Association membership to compete at the Trillium Championship Show.
- THJA memberships cannot be purchased at or during the Trillium Championship Show.
- Adult amateurs must hold current amateur status.

Non Showing Horses

- Non showing horses must be registered and a \$150+hst fee per horse will be charged.
- All horses on the property must have a signed entry blank and both owner and rider must provide a current OE of equivalent membership number.
- Non showing horses must abide by all Wesley Clover Parks rules.

Schooling Classes: Time and weather permitting schooling classes may be offered at the end of the day for a fee of \$40 per round. Multiple rounds are permitted. Riders must wear numbers.

There will be no Hors Concours permitted at the competition.

Prize Money

- Prize money will be credited to each horse's account.
- Prize money cheques will be made payable to the owner of the entry, unless the office is notified to pay the rider.
- Cheques will be mailed within 21 days of the close of the competition.
- Cheques will only be issued to entries whose accounts have been paid in full.

Wesley Clover Parks Facility Rules

- Participants are only allowed to bathe their horses in designated areas. Owners who bathe their horses outside of those areas will be fined \$50/incident. Please do not tie horses to the fence at the wash racks
- Competitors are allowed to lunge in designated areas only (Top lunging rings). There will be no lunging in any of the all weather footing rings. A fine of \$100/incident will be charged to any horse account found lunging in the incorrect rings.
- Any costs incurred to repair damage to property belonging to Wesley Clover Parks including but not limited to stabling tents, soccer fields, bridges etc will be charged back to the responsible barn.
- Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times as per NCC regulations, this rule will be strictly enforced. The owners of any dog caught off leash will be fined \$100/incident. Owners are required to abide by the poop and scoop by law.
- Camping is not permitted onsite but can be booked at the neighbouring Wesley Clover Parks Campground.
- Please keep horses that are not under tack in the barn areas. Grazing at the show rings is not permissible during horseshow hours.
- There is no riding of horses permitted after dark.
- We ask that if you are not entered in the divisions that are underway in the show rings, that you refrain from using the show warm up rings during that time.

Blacksmiths and Veterinarians

- A farrier will be available onsite during competition days. The vet will be on call.
- All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any bills for veterinary and farrier services.
- Farrier and veterinarian contact info will be posted at the Wesley Clover Parks office.

Prize Money Pay Outs

Prize money will be credited to each horse’s account. Prize cheques will be made payable to the owner of the entry, unless the office is notified to pay to the rider. Cheques will be mailed within 21 days of the close of the horse show and will be sent to the address on the entry form. Cheques will only be issued to those entries whose accounts have been paid in full. Prize money will be awarded as follows:

Horse Show Attire & Tack

- Formal show attire is required for all classes at the Trillium Championship Show.
- Draw reins will not be permitted in any classes.
- Horses must have proper tack as per EC Rules
- It is mandatory that all persons mounted on a horse anywhere on the competition grounds wear ASTM/SEI or BSI approved helmets secured with a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet.
- All persons mounted on a horse must wear an exhibitor number

Vehicles

- All vehicles must be parked in designated areas only.
- There is NO PARKING on the roads or in the barn areas at any time.

- All motorized vehicles (including golf carts, scooters, dirt bikes, 4 wheelers, etc) must be operated by fully licensed drivers only.

Equitation Classes

In the 2023 EC Rule Book, the guide for junior ages is:

Junior “A” – a rider who is 15, 16, 17 on January 1st.

Junior “B” – a rider who is 12, 13, 14 on January 1st.

Junior “C” – a rider who is under 12 on January 1st.

Junior “A” Riders may not ride “B” or “C” ponies.

Junior “B” Riders may ride “A”, “B”, or “C” ponies.

Junior “C” Riders may ride “A”, “B”, or “C” ponies.

For show purposes, ponies are to be divided as follows:

“A” ponies – over 13.2 hands, but not to exceed 14.2 hands

“B” ponies – over 12.2 hands, but not to exceed 13.2 hands

“C” ponies – do not exceed 12.2 hands

- Trillium “A” Equitation Over Fences – Open to Large Pony Division riders with fences at 2’9””; Children’s Division riders with fences at 3’; and Trillium Low/High division riders with fences at 3’3”. In the event that a rider competes in two different divisions requiring them to jump different heights, it will be their choice which height they will jump for the equitation over fences class. This choice needs to be indicated on the entry form.
- Trillium “B” and “C” Equitation Over Fences classes are open to small ponies with fences at 2’3”, medium ponies with fences at 2’6”, large ponies at 2’9” and horses at 3’.
- Adult Equitation – Adult equitation riders must be amateurs.
- A horse or pony ridden in an equitation class over fences, or in the jumper medal class may only be ridden in that class by one rider.
- In the event that a rider competes in two different divisions requiring them to jump different heights, it will be their choice which height they will jump for the equitation over fences class. This choice needs to be indicated on the entry form.

(Eligibility as per EC Rules)

Trillium Hunter Medals

Originally created in the image of the Jump Canada Medal, the Trillium Medal Class has evolved into a specialty class unique to the Trillium Circuit. Where a contradiction exists, these

specifications supersede those of the Equestrian Canada Jump Canada Medal. These classes are open to Junior and Amateur riders only. Riders may walk the course. Eligibility as per individual hunter division specs for that particular medal.

First Phase - Over Fences: Figure eight course of not less than eight jumps. Class is judged in accordance to Article G1008 Class Routine Over Fences. No additional tests over fences are permitted.

Second Phase - On The Flat: All contestants, or a minimum of ten shall be called back to perform at a walk, trot and canter. From a maximum of four competitors, the judge may call for a minimum of two or more requirements from Article G1009 Tests (Equestrian Canada Rule Book Section G)

Scoring: Medal classes will be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

Tack & Equipment: All tack and equipment remains the same for both phases. Restrictions as per Article G1003 through G1005 (Equestrian Canada Rule Book Section G)

Trillium Jumper Medal: Fences not to exceed 3'3"

Originally created on the image of the CET Medal, the Trillium Jumper Medal has evolved into a specialty class unique to the Trillium Circuit. These specifications supersede those of the Equestrian Canada CET medal. The class will have both a jumping phase and a flat phase. This class is open to Junior and Amateur riders only. It is judged as an equitation class with both a jumping and flat phase. Jumping phase to be ridden first.

Tack & Equipment: All tack and equipment remains the same for both phases. Only running martingales used in the conventional manner are permitted. No standing martingales, draw reins or restricted running martingales are permitted. Conservative coloured headgear (As per Article G1109) with no additional adornment. Stirrups are restricted as per Article G1109-G)

Judging: Jumping phase to be conducted under current Equine Canada jumper rules. In addition, the class will be judged on seat, hand, guidance and control. Jumper Medal to be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

Jumping Phase: The jumping phase should be over a course of at least nine (9) fences. Fences will not exceed 3'3" in height with a spread not to exceed the height. The course must contain at least one double or triple combination with at least one spread fence. Other spread fences are required elsewhere on the course. A Liverpool is optional.

Flat Phase - All riders, or a maximum of twelve who complete the Jumping Phase, shall be called back to perform on the flat. During the flat phase, riders will show a working walk, the working trot sitting, the working trot rising, and showing a lengthening of stride, the working canter and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. The working canter on the counter lead must be demonstrated for at least one full revolution of the ring in each direction. The top four riders in the flat phase will be asked to complete a short test determined by the judge. When this test is being ridden, the riders will turn their backs so they cannot watch the other competitors.

SILVER HUNTER DIVISIONS

Small/Medium Pony Hunter Division: Fences 2’3”

Open to ponies not exceeding 12.2hh (Smalls) and ponies exceeding 12.2hh, but not exceeding 13.2hh (Mediums). Small/Medium pony riders must be 14 years of age and under as of January 1st of the competition year.

Large Pony Hunter Division: Fences 2’9”

Open to ponies exceeding 13.2hh, but not exceeding 14.2hh. Large pony riders must be 17 years of age and under as of January 1st of the competition year.

Modified Pony Hunter

Open to all ponies. Ponies will jump 3” below their regular pony hunter division height and distances will be adjusted according to pony size as per EC Rules G306.6.A. Age restrictions as per EC Rules G306.1. Pony/rider combinations may not cross enter into any other **silver** classes or divisions requiring them to jump.

Small – Not to exceed 2’

Medium – Not to exceed 2’3”

Large – Not to exceed 2’6”

Short Stirrup Division: Fences not to exceed 21” (Verticals Only)

Open to “C” riders. Riders may not enter any other classes except for “C” Equitation on the flat and My First Medal. Open to both horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted. Riders in the flat class must be short stirrup eligible.

Adult Amateur Divisions

- All adult amateurs must possess a current EC amateur card which is purchased annually.

- Adult amateurs may ride horses or large ponies. Please note that a pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition (G201.2)

Adult Amateur Hunter: Fences 3'

As per Equestrian Canada Article G309. Riders in this division may cross enter to the Trillium Hunter Division at 3'3".

2'9' Adult Amateur Hunter Division: Fences 2'9"

A horse/rider combination may only cross enter into the hack division, the low/high open hunter division, the 2'9 adult medal, and adult equitation on the flat class. Riders may enter in any other division or class at that show on another horse or pony. The horse may be shown in another class/division with another rider.

2'6" Amateur Division

Riders are not eligible to compete in any division with a height over 2'6", except for the low/high open hunter division. Horse/rider combinations are permitted to also show in the hack division and adult equitation on the flat.

Junior Divisions

- Open to horses ridden by juniors.

Children's Hunter: Fences 3'0"

As per Equestrian Canada Rules Article G307.

2'9' Children's Hunter Division: Fences 2'9"

A horse/rider combination may only cross enter into the hack division, the low/high open hunter division, the 2'9 children's medal, and age appropriate equitation on the flat class. Riders may enter in any other division or class at that show on another horse or pony. The horse may be shown in another class/division with another rider.

2'6" Children's Division

Riders are not eligible to compete in any division with a height over 2'6", except for the low/high open hunter division. Horse/rider combinations are also permitted show in the hack division and their age appropriate equitation on the flat.

Open Divisions

Low/High Open Hunter Division: Fences 2'6" and 2'9"

Open to all horses. No ponies are permitted. Horse/rider combinations may only cross enter to divisions requiring them to jump 2'9" and under, hack division, and their age appropriate equitation on the flat. Competitors may move both up and down in heights between shows, but competitors may not change heights once the division has started. *Competitors must declare height on their Championship Show Entry Form.*

Low Hunter: Fences 3'

Open to all horses.

Trillium Hunter – Low/High: Fences 3'3" and 3'6"

The low option of this division is open to all eligible riders. The high option of this division is not open to children's, adult amateur division riders or riders competing in lower children's and adults amateur divisions.

Hack Division

As per Equestrian Canada Chapter 12 and 13 – Classes Refer to Article G1301-1303

SILVER JUMPER DIVISIONS

0.90M Jumper Division

Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum spread 1M. Run under Table A.

1.0M Jumper Division

Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum spread 1.10M. Run under Table A.

1.10M. – Trillium Jumper Division

Open to all horses. Maximum spread 1.20M. Run under Table A.

BRONZE BY THE THJA DIVISIONS

These divisions are sanctioned Bronze by Equestrian Canada

Cross Rail Hunter Division – 12”

Open to all horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted. Riders may only cross-enter into age appropriate equitation on the flat and hack division.

Long Stirrup Hunter Division – 21” (Verticals Only)

Open to riders 12 years of age and older on January 1st. Long stirrup riders may not enter any other classes except for age appropriate equitation on the flat and hack division. Open to both horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted.

2’3” Open Hunter Division – Fences 2’3”

Open to all horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted.

0.75M Jumper Division

Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum spread .85m. Combinations are limited to a minimum of two strides -- vertical to vertical or oxer to vertical.

Specialty Classes

Mini Prix

Open to all horses who have shown at the 2023 Trillium Championships. The course will consist of a twelve obstacle first round, and a shortened jump off to follow after each competitor has completed the first round. Riders must be present and mounted for presentations.

****Mini Prix will run by posted order. No exceptions.****

\$2000 - .90M Mini Prix

\$2000 - 1M/1.10M Mini Prix

Pony & Hunter Derbies

Derby to consist of one round with each horse receiving a numerical score. The first round will consist of a hunter course with at least 12 jumps.

1. Hunter score (out of 100) - The class is judged as a handy hunter class with a score
2. High performance bonus (up to 10 bonus points) - Two bonus points awarded for each high performance option taken on course (e.g., higher jump, natural jumps, more challenging line options), at least three options will be offered on course)
3. Handy bonus (up to 10 bonus points) – Zero to ten additional bonus points awarded at the judge's discretion for additional handiness and high performance displayed on course, including: Unique turns and approaches, inside turns, slices, athleticism and boldness (e.g., big gallop to jumps), impressionable start and finish.

There will be a course walk for this class.

Horses must be jogged (mounted) for soundness.

****Derbies will run by posted order. No exceptions.****

\$2000 Pony Derby

Open to any pony that has shown at the 2023 Trillium Championships. Offered at regulation height for ponies.

\$2000 Grass Ring Derbies

Open to any horse that has shown at the 2023 Trillium Championships. Separate classes as below:

2'6 Derby

2'9 Derby

3' Derby

Lead Line Class

For children up to the age of 7. Entry fee is \$10. Leaders must be at least 16 years of age. Please complete an entry blank so the announcer knows your child and their mount's names.

.75M Equitation Classic

Open to any horse shown at .75M and under at the 2022 Trillium Championships. This class will have both a jumping phase and a flat phase with additional testing options at the judge's discretion. Jumping phase to be ridden first. Judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

Jumping Phase: The jumping phase should be over an equitation type course of at least nine (9) fences. Fences will not exceed .75M in height with a spread not to exceed the height.

Flat Phase - All riders, or a maximum of twelve who complete the jumping phase, shall be called back to perform on the flat and demonstrate tests on the flat of the judge's choosing. The top four riders in the flat phase may then be asked to complete a short test including fences determined by the judge. When this test is being ridden, the riders will turn their backs so they cannot watch the other competitors.

Horsemanship Challenge

Open to all horse/rider combinations who are not eligible to compete in the grass ring derbies. Class will consist of a flat phase judged as equitation, and some additional testing. Competitors may be required to jump one small fence as part of the testing at the judge's discretion.

THJA Provincial Cup

This class will take on a similar format to a FEI Nations Cup class where groups put forward a team to represent them and compete for top honours! This class aims to unite would be competitors in camaraderie at Trillium Championship Show and encourage team work amongst all. Entry fee is \$100 per team (\$25 each).

Team Selection:

Competitors are encouraged to create their own team of four horses and register them with the office. Ideally they have competitors at each height, but this isn't required in 2023.

Chef D'Equipe Selection:

The team will select their Chef D'Equipe and advise the office with their entry.

Round One:

Each team member competes over a jumper course at their respective height. Their faults are added together to make up the Team Score for Round One.

Round Two:

One team member will compete over a second course at their respective height. Their faults will be added to the Team Score.

Jump Off:

If there is a tie after round two, there will be a jump off against the clock. The fastest time with the fewest faults will be the winner. Only one rider may jump off and it cannot be the rider who competed in round two.

Equitation Finals

Provincial Equitation Finals Ride Off

The top two placings in each equitation and medal class will each receive an invitation to the Trillium Championship Provincial Equitation Ride Off to take place on the grass derby field at the end of the schedule on Saturday. Participants will be tested by the judging panel on the flat only, to determine the top equitation rider as part of the celebration of the Trillium Championship Show Equitation Finals! The judging panel will award the top three placings. Good luck to all our equitation riders!

Tack and equipment for the Ride Off as per Equestrian Canada equitation rules. No martingales.
